

## Sustain Me Conference Trip Summary

I presented on three occasions at this conference in well-attended sessions. In these sessions, one of which was to welcome the Shabbath with praise music and prayer, I was able to deliver very serious messages concerning the construction of the name Yah and its declension ([see my latest blog](#)), and I was also able to discuss the error of the ineffable name doctrine. This conference was not an occasion to preach to the choir, but rather to disclose these important truths to people who had never heard of these ideas before.
